Adoption agency focused on finding families for teens in foster care hires new Executive Director

You Gotta Believe (YGB) is excited to announce the hiring of Jennifer Pinder as Executive Director.

YGB selected Ms. Pinder after an extensive search led by board members and Mary Keane, the outgoing Executive Director. Ms. Keane will remain with the organization as Senior Advisor, overseeing YGB family programs.

There, Ms. Pinder was a strategic leader in partnerships with multiple Federal agencies including the Office of Planning, Research, and Evaluation; the Office of Head Start; the Children's Bureau; the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

“As an adoptee, I have a unique appreciation for the loving, lifelong support network a family provides and I am excited to join an organization that has an established, 25-year history of finding permanent families for older children in foster care,” says Ms. Pinder. “I look forward to working with the talented and committed YGB staff and board, many of whom were either adopted from foster care or are parents to kids

adopted from foster care. I am eager to continue our collaboration with Children's Village and grow our partnerships in the field to continue YGB's mission."

YGB focuses exclusively on finding permanent parents and families for the most vulnerable kids in foster care. No child should leave the foster care system without a lifelong support network of a family in place. **Everyone deserves a family – and that family is a critical element to human health and prosperity.**

Today, more than 400,000 children are in foster care in the US, and every year, as many as 19,000 of them will age out of the foster care system. Without the safety net of a forever family to provide the security and comfort most take for granted, these young people are left on their own to face a future filled with hardships — from lack of education to unemployment, higher rates of incarceration, poor health, early parenthood, or homelessness (as much as 40 percent of these kids will experience this devastation in their lifetimes). In New York City alone, there are more than 1000 kids currently awaiting adoption, with more than 900 kids on the verge of aging out. Together, we work toward the day when no child ages out.
